Chess clocks were used on all games with a Blitz time of 10 minutes each. Six rounds were played with a break mid-way through.

Only two Level-0 (under age 9) players turned up and they were put in with the Level-1's. However, any Level-1 player had to give them Q+B odds, but were guaranteed a draw or a win, and the same applied for the Level-0 players. Slightly irregular scoring, but it solved a problem !

Senior Section:

Even though mixing Levels may seem a little tough, it can produce surprising results, as a Level-3 player, Robbie Meaney came joint 1st in the Senior group this time. Adults are also encouraged to play from Level-2 upwards, but are seldom available.
