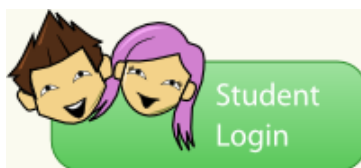
Beginners and Improvers Project – Puzzle Championship:



This is both a problem-solving competition, with lot’s prizes and an educational tool to develop thinking skills. At the start puzzles are easy, *perfect for beginners*. As players progress to higher level puzzles they will start to calculate several moves ahead.

There are 2 short how-to videos on www.movesforlife.ie for Teachers and Parents.

Puzzle solving improves many elements of thinking skill. And to reward application by players we will be awarding the tittle of Irish Champion (Chess Puzzle Solver) to the best performing players at each age group.



There are Prizes to be won for the highest points scorers in each age group. The 10 age groups are from U-8’s up to U-16. The event is *free*, and the platform we are using is www.chessossity.com and it is open to all students in your school.

Playing Project – Daily Online Chess Games:
